Overview

The Harry A Koch Co. has advised the Learning Community on insurance matters since its inception. Existing coverage includes a General Liability, Business Automobile, Umbrella & Property Policies provided by Philadelphia Indemnity Insurance Co., a Workers' Compensation Policy provided by Accident Fund Insurance Co of America, Professional Liability – School Board Legal Liability provided by Allied World Surplus Lines Insurance Co & a crime policy provided by Travelers Casualty & Surety Co of America. The Proposed insurance keeps the same policies and coverage from the most of the same providers, School Board Legal Liability will be provided by XL Catlin/Indian Harbor, for a slightly less than 0.04% increase, or \$27.50.

Supporting Detail

The Learning Community did not make a claim on the existing policy, and has only made one claim for its existence relating to Professional liability due to a court challenge for the common levy when it was first introduced.

While, in general, property premiums were increasing throughout Nebraska due to weather and other similar claims, because of our claim history, and because we do not own the structure, the Property policy saw a year on year decrease of \$215.00, or -18.66%. Our Automobile, Employee Benefits Liability, Crime (2nd year of 2 year term), School Board Legal Liability policies were unchanged. The General Liability, including Sexual & Physical Abuse, & Umbrella policies increased less than 1%, or \$182.00 & \$31.00 respectively, consistent with the larger insurance market for similar entities.

The Workers' Compensation insurance policy had the largest percentage increase of just over 11%, which amounted to a \$287.00 increase. This increase was due to the increase of labor costs resulting from the increase in activity at the North Center as the program is refined and expanded.

Budget

The Budget, Finance and Audit Subcommittee met and discussed the insurance proposal outlined in the following handout and were satisfied with the coverage provided at the price listed. Additionally, the Learning Community FY 2017-18 budget has sufficient funds to cover the proposed expenses.

A CHANGE IN NEBRASKA WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2003

Corporate officers owning 25% or more of common stock must "opt-in" to workers compensation coverage. Sole-Proprietors, Partners, LLC's and Self-Employed Persons have opted in for many years.

With the passage of LB 417 in 2002, Nebraska workers' compensation laws were changed effective January 1, 2003 to bring all corporate executive officers owning 25% or more of common stock into the same category as sole-proprietors, partners and self-employed persons. In other words, such executive officers are no longer automatically covered under workers' compensation insurance policies and must "opt-in" to coverage just as other classes have been able to since 1984. The new law also states that if an executive officer does not "opt-in" to workers' compensation coverage and a health, accident, or other insurance policy covering the officer excludes coverage if the insured is otherwise entitled to workers' compensation coverage, such exclusion is null and void for that executive officer. The law also makes the Named Insured responsible for notification of any changes in corporate officers and stock ownership.

This form will be filed with The Koch Co., your insurance carrier, and should be kept with your corporate records as well.
