Bringing Children's Backgrounds to the Foreground in Their Learning

Ensuring children have opportunities to learn and develop through experiences that connect new ideas and concepts to their existing knowledge, interests, and cultural values is critically important. This comprehensive PD for All series is designed to promote deeper, more engaging, and effective learning experiences for early childhood teachers, child care providers, and members of the community through a variety of opportunities to gain knowledge and plan, implement, and reflect on how to tap into children's funds of knowledge. 


